2022 saw a step into the world of theatre with 'Brown Boys Swim', a play by Karim Khan which won the Scotsman Fringe First award at the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, as well as the BBC Popcorn Writing Award.

Other notable scores include 'Mother's Ruin', an animated musical starring Paul Whitehouse and Jaime Winstone; and a foray into 8-bit music with the video game, 'Obviously Inappropriate Content'.
